
Military Ad Campaign

The Yap Visitors Bureau is currently working on an advertising campaign that will target the military communities in Guam, Japan and Okinawa to promote Yap as a vacation destination. The print and digital ads will appear in Stars & Stripes, a U.S. Department of Defense publication that reaches enlisted men and women as wells as civilian employees and contractors working on the bases in those areas. The first ad will appear on January 17 online and in the Stars & Stripes magazine soon after.
