ROTA LEADERS TAKE HAFA ADAI & TIROW PLEDGE

Saipan, Northern Mariana Islands (**NMI**) – On the heels of a similar signing ceremony in Tinian last week, government and business leaders of Rota are the latest to join the Hafa Adai & Tirow Pledge program, vowing to help promote the indigenous Chamorro and Carolinian cultures of The Marianas.

On Monday (June 21) Mayor of Rota Efraim Atalig led seven other individuals in a pledge ceremony with representatives of the Marianas Visitors Authority (MVA) and Saipan Chamber of Commerce, who jointly operate the pledge program.

"We're pleased to officially launch the Hafa Adai & Tirow Pledge program in the Luta community, best known as the Friendly Island," said MVA Managing Director Priscilla M. Iakopo. "Rota is an excellent example of how indigenous Marianas culture remains vibrant and a part of everyday life in family, community, and business."

The program welcomes all businesses, organizations, and companies interested in strengthening the core values and traditions of indigenous Chamorro and Carolinian cultures.
