In Loving Memory

A very dear friend of the PATA Micronesia Chapter, Dr. John Salas, passed away on January 26, 2018 at age 70.

Dr. Salas is remembered as a pioneer in Guam's education and a humble servant of the community, who has inspired everyone around him. His commitment to improving education and the quality of life for the people of Micronesia was his passion.

Dr. Salas served as senator during the 25th and 26th Guam Legislatures, from 1999 to 2003, and was chairman of the committee on lands and also the judiciary committee.

Dr. Salas graduated from Father Duenas in 1965, completed his doctoral studies at the University of Connecticut, and went on a distinguished career in the island's public and private sectors.

Dr. Salas, who was a Professor of Tourism at the University of Guam, also was the University's President and Vice President of Academic Affairs. Prior to this, he started his career as deputy director of the Department of Education and because the first provost at the former Vocational High School, now known as the Guam Community College.

His exceptional work was not limited to Guam. Dr. Salas is recognized throughout the region of Micronesia. He was an active PATA Micronesia Chapter member for several decades and was Chairman of the Board of Directors. Dr. Salas was instrumental in carrying out the Chapter's educational goals by providing training throughout the region. Under his leadership, the PATA Micronesia Chapter won the PATA Chapter of the Year Award and hosted the first PATA executive official visit to the region.

We ask that you keep Dr. Salas and his family in your prayers during this difficult time.

UNITED EXTEND KOSRAE SERVICE INCREASE INTO MAY 2018

United Airlines has announced that the previously planned 3 weekly flights to Kosrae, scheduled from January 12, 2018 - March 19, 2018, has been extended until May 21, 2018.

The 3rd weekly Kosrae service will be operated as Guam – Chuuk – Pohnpei – Kosrae – Majuro – Honolulu.

Overall service increase for the Island Hopper to the following remains unchanged, commencing January 21, 2018: Chuuk (from 4 to 5 weekly), Pohnpei (from 4 to 5 weekly) and Majuro (from 3 to 4 weekly).

CAROLINE ISLANDS AIR TO TAKE OVER YAP-PALAU ROUTE

COLONIA, Yap — United Airlines' decision to suspend flights between Yap and Palau as of January 7, has left a gaping hole in regional transportation, which now may be addressed.

Thursday afternoon, a delegation from FSM and Yap took off from Yap International Airport in the Harbin Y-12 airplane that was donated to Caroline Islands Air (CIA) by China. CIA is the FSM government-subsidized airline. The group was headed to Palau to meet with their counterparts to review and sign an agreement for the small aircraft to take over the route.

The delegation included Mr. Vincent Figir, former Governor of Yap State; the Honorable Bruno Tharngan, Chairman of the Council of Pilung; His Excellency Peter M. Christian, President of the FSM; the Honorable Tony Ganngiyan, Governor of Yap State; the Honorable Joses Gallen, Secretary of the FSM Department of Justice; the Honorable Lukner Weilbacher, Secretary of the FSM Department of Transportation, Communication & Infrastructure; and Mr. Alex Tretnoff, CEO of Caroline Islands Air and recently certified pilot for the Harbin Y-12.

On Thursday, February 1, 2018, Governor of the CNMI, Ralph D.L.B. Torres, and Governor of Guam, Eddie B. Calvo, formally opened the inaugural meeting of the Marianas Working Group.



Both Governors welcomed more than 100 participants from the various Guam and CNMI government agencies and private sector entities the two-day meeting, which was held at the Saipan World Resort.

The working group was formed last December 2017 in an effort to deal with common issues such as the workforce, illegal drugs, the military buildup, the rhino beetle and endangered species, among other topics.

"In the next two days, we will engage in meaningful dialogue to identify common ground on issues such as workforce and education, commerce and ports, homeland security and public safety, health and food security, finance and taxation, land environment and veterans affairs, infrastructure utility and telecommunications," said Representative Angel Demapan.


